

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - TO ALL VIPMOAA MEMBERS

OK! It happened at our March 28th meeting, I was decertified as the VP of the Chapter and re-elected to be the President of VIPMOAA. Not so much that I wanted to have that distinction, but rather that the long serving leadership and Board of Directors were not able to convince some of our younger members that now was the time to step up and keep VIPMOAA on its 5-Star MOAA Chapter trajectory. The election on 28 March also brought in our new Treasurer, Frank Tavenner and our new Secretary, Dan Warren. Also, with a reminder to me during the meeting our newly appointed Membership Chairman, Maria Tavenner, was recognized. The election however, did not fill an important elected position - that of Vice-President. Myself and the Board will be searching to find a qualified candidate to fill that position. To that end if you are interested in learning more about what our VP does and would like to be considered please reach out to me. I really do need a side kick.

As I look back over my time as one of the leaders of the Chapter, I am happy to be the recipient of all the support that our members have given to the Chapter and to our community. Our members freely and consistently have given their time, talents, and financial support to continue to make VIPMOAA a robust community support and social organization in the peninsula area.

I recently gave a presentation at the Chesapeake Senior Living community in Newport News about VIPMOAA and why retired military officers should join our Chapter. In developing that presentation, I compiled some of our Chapter accomplishments over the past 10 years. The impact is remarkable. VIPMOAA has contributed over \$19,000 to support non-profit community organizations that support veterans and community needs. Our members have made donations that have provided \$56,000 for college scholarships to outstanding Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) cadets at the peninsula's high school JROTC programs, and over \$3,800 in JROTC Leadership Awards over the same 10-year period. In addition, member donations have allowed our Chapter to provide over \$6,000 in Leadership Awards to outstanding ROTC Cadets at our Williams & Mary, Christopher Newport University, and Hampton University.

SAN DIEGO AIR & SPACE MUSEUM

The museum has a very interesting display about the Milestones of Flight which provides a peek into the world of air and space with key moments throughout history. From the feather and wax wings used by Daedalus and Icarus in Greek mythology to the first powered and controlled aircraft on another planet, people have been fascinated by flight. How can we lift something above the Earth? How far will it go and how fast will it move? Can it go farther and faster? Can we lift people? What will they see and learn from up there? This gallery represents a larger, ongoing story about the people who asked these questions and the science they used to answer them. We invite you to explore, ask your own questions, and be a part of the story.

The first Milestone listed was about Louis Bleriot who was the inventor of the Bleriot aircraft. He flew from Calais to Dover on July 15, 1909. This was the first successful flight of a monoplane, or aircraft with one set of wings, over the English Channel. On April 16, 1912, Harriet Quimby also flew a Bleriot XI from Dover to Calais, becoming the first female to fly across the channel. Hundreds of these aircraft were produced between 1909 and 1914.

GENESIS PORTAL ALLOWS REFILLS

The Defense Health Agency has launched a new feature that lets you request prescription refills through MHS GENESIS. MHS GENESIS is the Department of Defense's new electronic health record. It's now in use at every military hospital and clinic worldwide.

You can now easily refill your prescriptions by selecting the "Rx Refills" tab in the upper right panel on the portal's homepage.

Through your MHS GENESIS Patient Portal, you'll be able to:

- See all your prescriptions that are available to be refilled.
- Choose which ones you want refilled.
- Choose where you want to pick up the refill.
- See when your prescriptions are ready to be picked up.

This new feature applies to existing prescriptions that have remaining refills. The system determines a prescription is ready to be refilled when you've completed 75% of the previous fill. Your prescriptions won't be eligible for refill before that time. You need a renewal when your prescription has no refills left, or has expired, and you still need the medication. You can use the MHS GENESIS secure messaging feature to request a renewal.

TORII GATES MEANING TO OUR AIRFORCES IN SOUTH KOREA

At the entranceway to most shrines stands a large gate called a torii. Different types of torii can be found at Shinto shrines, no matter their size and shape, they all are a symbol to mark the transition from the normal everyday world to the sacred. Throughout Asia, the Torii Gate brought peace, luck, long life and tranquility.



The meaning of this tradition was not lost on the American airmen that daily risked their lives in defense of South Korea and the US interests there. In an attempt to have these traditions rub off on the aircrews, Torii Gates were constructed at many US operated airbases and used as a portal to the flight line.



A famous photo of the torii gate leading to the Sabre flight line at Kimpo Air Base, is pictured at the right. The airfield was originally constructed in 1939-42. In 1958, the airport was redesigned and named Gimpo after the nearby city of Gimpo.

FIVE MEN, 55 MIGS by Nixon Galloway, Kimpo Airfield near Seoul, Korea, is a famous painting in the art collection of the Air Force. The pilots in the picture are: (Left to Right) Captain Lonnie R. Moore, 10 MIGs Colonel Vermont Garrison, 10 MIGs and 7.33 Kills in WWII Colonel James K. Johnson, 10 MIGs and 1 Luftwaffe in WWII Captain Ralph S. Parr, 10 Kills in Korea and Major James Jabara, 15 MIGs and 1.5 Victories in Europe in WWII. The aircraft are North American F-86 Sabre Jets.




